#### About the book

The growth of administrative law in Australia has continued in an unabated form since the introduction of innovative reforms in the mid-seventies. The centre plank of these reforms was the establishment of the Administrative Appeals Tribunal with follow-on reforms relating to the Ombudsman, judicial review and freedom of information legislation.

The impact of these reforms has been vast and significant. This book seeks to take stock of the growth and development of administrative law principles. Particular attention is paid to the important cases and key doctrines which provide the theoretical underpinnings of these principles.

In this book, a team of highly respected scholars from academia, the practising legal profession and the judiciary provide a lucid exposition of the fundamental principles and doctrines of Australian administrative law.

**Dr Matthew Groves** is Senior Lecturer in Law at the Faculty of Law, Monash University where he teaches public law, legal ethics and succession law. Matthew is co-author of Aronson, Dyer and Groves', *Judicial Review of Administrative Action* (3rd edn, 2004) and has published widely on administrative law, prison management and military law.

**Professor HP Lee** is the Sir John Latham Professor of Law at Monash University, where he is currently Deputy Dean of the Faculty of Law. He teaches and researches in Australian constitutional law and comparative constitutional law. His major works include HP Lee and G Winterton (eds), *Australian Constitutional Landmarks* (2003), E Campbell and HP Lee, *The Australian Judiciary* (2001), HP Lee, *Constitutional Conflicts in Contemporary Malaysia* (1995) and HP Lee, *Emergency Powers* (1984). He is also currently the Vice-Chairman of the Australian Press Council.
