He has served as a consultant to the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development and to Government agencies in Canada and the United States. Daniel is the author of several books, including *Venture Capital and Tax Incentives: A Comparative Study of Canada and the United States*, the most comprehensive analysis of venture capital tax expenditure programs in Canada and the United States. He has written numerous articles in national and international journals and has spoken at conferences worldwide on various aspects of tax law and policy.



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Stephen Barkoczy is an Associate Professor with the Faculty of Law at Monash University and a Consultant with Blake Dawson Waldron. He has consulted to the Australian Government and is a member of the Advisory Panel to the Board of Taxation. Stephen has published and presented widely on taxation law in Australia and overseas and is co-author (with Don Maloney and Wayne Ngo) of the *Pooled Development Funds Handbook*, which is the leading reference work on the PDF Program. Stephen's other books include *Australian Taxation Law*, *Australian Tax Casebook*, *Core Tax Legislation and Study Guide* and *The Australian GST Guide*.
